The City Council of the City of Eminence, Kentucky met in regular session on Monday, July 13, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. with Mayor Fred Downey and the following members present: Lee Ann Armstrong, Karen Paris, Phillip Smith, Bobbie Jo Frazier, and Connie Nation. Absent was Member Justin Wayman. Also, in attendance were City Attorney Chelsey Brammell, City Clerk Robin Mullins, Police Chief Scott Wilcoxson, Fire Chief Steve Lucas, Utility Clerk Donna Rangel, Public Work Director Troy Popp, Utility Maintenance J.R. Ellis, Asst. Public Works Director Jonathan Bates, Henry County Local Representative Joe Durban, and Residents Doug Bates, Ronetta Vargas, Kenya Vargas, Wayne Dixie, Steve Metcalfe, Missy Ayers, and Mr. & Mrs. Russell Merker .

Mayor Downey called the Public Hearing to order at 6:00 p.m. ET/5:00 p.m. CT.

Pledge of allegiance held.

Subject: Shooting on East Broadway & Police Presence – Kenya Vargas was at the council meeting to report a shooting on East Broadway that happened Saturday, July 11, 2026, that could have killed her two-year-old child, sister, finance and herself. She reported she called 911 at 11:36 p.m. and an officer didn't show up until 12:15 a.m.

Ms. Vargas asked for more police presence during cruise night, because only one officer was on duty.

Also Ms. Vargas asked if something could be done about speeding on E. Broadway, maybe speed bumps. Mayor Downey will get a speed bump installed.

Motion made by Member Smith and seconded by Member Frazier to approve the minutes as presented. On a call for votes, all members present voted "Yea".

NEW BUSINESS:

Subject: Resolution for Statewide Emergency Management Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement – Attorney Brammell gave a brief overview of Resolution for Statewide Emergency Management Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement.

Motion made by Member Frazier and seconded by Member Smith approved the Statewide Emergency Management Mutual Aid and Assistance Agreement Resolution. On a call for votes, all members present voted “Yea”.

Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Mayor to sign the Agreement Between the Commonwealth of Kentucky Transportation Cabinet Department of Highways and the City of Eminence – Attorney Brammell gave a brief overview of the Resolution which is for the LARP Funds.

Motion made by Member Frazier and seconded by Member Nation to authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement between the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the City of Eminence for the LARP Funds. On a call for votes, all members present voted “Yea”.

Subject: Surplus Property John Deer Skid Steer – Public Works Director Popp stated we were ready to put the skid steer out for bid as surplus property, since the new one is coming tomorrow.

Motion made by Member Armstrong and seconded by Member Frazier, Pursuant to KRS 82.083 the City would like to dispose the John Deer Skid Steer that was purchased for the purpose of street maintenance and leak repairs. The reason for disposition is a new skid steer was purchase and it will be put out for bid. On a call for votes, all members present voted “Yea”.

Subject: Surplus Property Five-Foot King Kutter Bushhog – Public Works Director Popp stated the bushhog should be put out for bid as surplus property because it hadn’t been used in years and it’s too small.

Motion made by Member Frazier and seconded by Member Smith, Pursuant to KRS 82.083 the City would like to dispose of the Country Pride Bushhog that was purchased to bushhog the sewer plant. The reason for disposition is it’s too small and hadn’t been used in a long time. The bushhog will be put out to bid. On a call for votes. All members present voted “Yea”.

Mayor’s Update – Mayor Downey stated we should be ready to bid out the Five Roads soon.

Mayor Downey reported we will be applying for more roads to be paved soon.

Also, Mayor Downey reported we are going to hire another person for the Public Works Department. The position will be posted in the paper and website in the next couple of weeks.

Council – New Business – Member Armstrong wanted to thank the mayor for suggesting a committee for the Coach D Park Upgrade. The committee had spoken to one company about mulch replacement with the option of a grant to use towards another piece of equipment. Another idea the committee had were trees and benches which the community could purchase or donate.

Member Armstrong also reported the ACDC Committee will participate in one or two days of the state fair. Magnets have been purchase for giveaways. A city-wide yard sale will be held on September 5th, with dumpsters and food trucks.

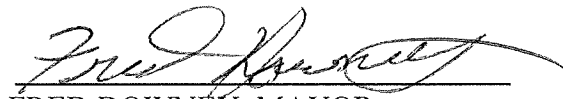
Member Armstrong reported Theater Down Stream will use the council chambers on August 14, 15, and 16 for their production.

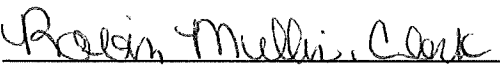
Member Armstrong reported August 8th is the Back-to-School Event at the library, she is still waiting to hear when the school will have theirs.

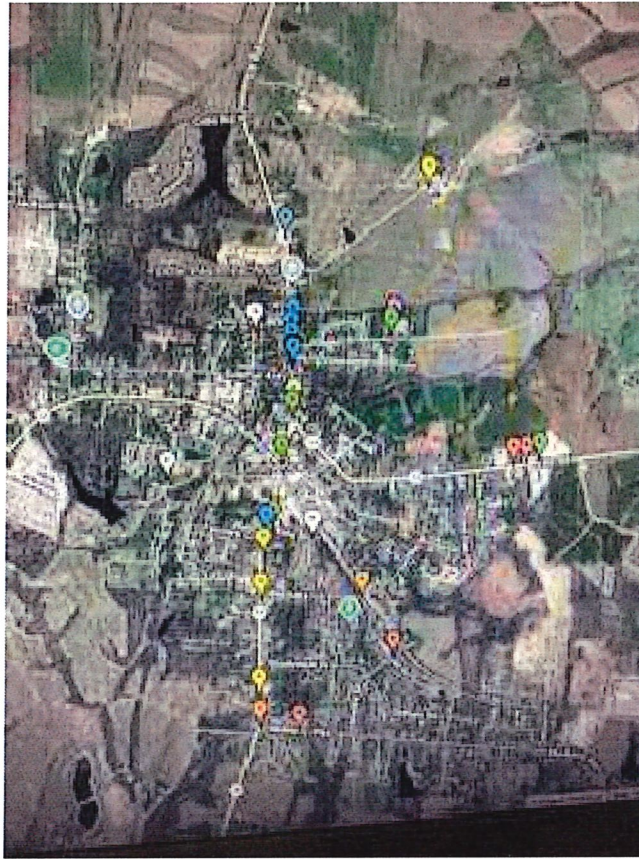
Comments

Public Works Activity Report JUNE 2026

City Department:

- Routine - We picked up & emptied trash and performed typical upkeep & maintenance of City property, Mowing and Bushhogging season.
- Public Works have been preparing for summer and cleaning up around the sewer plant, removing limbs, trash, clearing overgrown vegetation on side streets & also, they had the Backhoe building insulated with spray foam.
- Speed Bump signs will be installed on both sides of speed bumps throughout the city streets.
- 2 bags of Perma Patch were put into the hole on the right side of the entrance to Lou Avenue off N. Main St. (State was contacted and will check it to see if they are responsible for repairs to this apron).
- Some potholes are still showing up on city streets, we are addressing them as we have them reported.
- Near 318/323 Shadyview Dr, Public Works will be getting some estimates to replace the collapsed culvert pipe that runs under the road.
- E Broadway Ave/Ballardsville Rd (Hwy 22) the paving has been completed by LIBS Paving around 7 miles of new asphalt.
- 2 Bags of Perma Patch were placed at the entrance of Lou Ave; we contacted Ky Hwy Dept to see if they are responsible for replacing or repairing the entrance off State Hwy.

Water Department:

- Routine-We performed required samples, utility locates, read meters, and maintained the water distribution system.
- 3 water meters were set on Zelcova Dr. in the new Arborview subdivision.

Wastewater Department:

- Routine-We performed required samples; utility locates and maintained the wastewater collection system and treatment plant.
- 3 Manholes have been repaired in the city- Bell Avenue and Crabb Ave areas.

- Strand engineering came for the 60% design completion meeting for the Sewer Plant expansion.
- The permit for the Sewer Force Main extension on Mulberry Pike has been applied for by Strand Engineering.

Coach D Park Updates:

- Jr has still been picking up trash on the walking trail & throughout the city, removing vegetation, limbs, and mowing and weed eating at Coach D Park.
