

CITY COUNCIL SPECIALMEETING

FEBRUARY 24, 2025
EMINENCE, KENTUCKY

The City Council of the City of Eminence, Kentucky met in a special session on Monday, February 24, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. with Mayor Fred Downey and the following members present: LeeAnn Armstrong, Bobbi Jo Frazier, Phillip Smith, and Connie Nation. Absent were Karen Paris and Justin Wayman. Also, in attendance were City Attorney Chelsey Brammell, City Clerk Robin Mullins, Police Chief Scott Wilcoxson, Fire Chief Steve Lucas, Fire Fighter Mike Lucas, and Henry County Local Editor Joe Durbin.

Mayor Downey called the special meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Pledge of allegiance held.

The special meeting was called to go over line-item changes and future land use maps.

Subject: Line-Item Changes – Clerk Mullins presented the following line-item changes to the council:

Move \$6,000 from 21-621 Office Supplies → 21-920 Capital Expenditures for
Ballistic
Shields

Move \$40,000 from 22-626 Contractual Fees → 22-920 Capital Expenditures for
Vehicle
Purchase

Recategorize 22-920 Equipment Upgrade \$6,000.00 to Vehicle
Purchase

Recategorize 22-920 Matching Grant Funds \$6,000.00 to Vehicle
Purchase

Motion made by Member Smith and seconded by Member Frazier to approve the line-item changes as presented on a call for votes, all members present voted, “Yea”.

Subject: Future Land Use Maps – Mayor Downey and the council discussed the following map changes for future land use:

Property on Ballardsville Road (Highway 22) – Zoned I1

Two Lots off West Broadway – Zoned I1

Property on Eminence Road (Left Side of North Main Leaving Town) – R1

Property on Right Side of North Main Street leaving Town – R1

Property on Elm Street next two Old Peoples Bank Front Five Acres – B2

Back Two Lots off Elm Street that back up two Maple Ave – R1

Property on Highway 55 going toward Shelbyville one left side – R2

Member Armstrong reported she was concerned about the traffic and pollution industry would bring to Main Street.

A consensus of the council was that growth needs to happen in the city through future zone changes.

Mayor Downey reported Clerk Mullins would put the changes in writing, and we would go over them at the next regular meeting and finalize the map.

With no further business to be discussed, the motion made was by Member Frazier and seconded by Member Nation to adjourn. All members present voted “Yea”. The meeting was adjourned at 6:33 p.m.
